1. All persons entering this ground are only admitted subject to these rules and regulations of the Football Association
2. The Club reserves the right to prosecute or to eject, or cause to be ejected, any persons who within the ground or the club premises is considered by the club, it's employees or agents (hereafter called the Club), in their absolute discretion to be, or to have been, behaving in any of the following ways:-
 - a) Entering the field of play before or during the course of a game of a game. The field of play is that area within the railings surrounding the perimeter of the pitch.
 - b) Using obscene or abusive language or persistent swearing.
 - c) Being drunk or under the influence of drink or drugs to any degree.
 - d) Making vulgar gestures.
 - e) Using terms of abuse, racial or otherwise.
- 3) No bottles, metal cans, glasses, placards, banners, firearms, knives or other similar articles are permitted and the Police and Club stewards have the right to search any spectator at anytime, and to confiscate any article which they consider could be a danger to other spectators.
4. NO alcohol to be consumed within the ground. Alcohol can only be consumed within the confines of the Clubhouse. Passes are available at half-time.
5. The climbing of floodlight pylons, stands and other building structures is strictly forbidden. Club Stewards have the right to eject any persons found doing so.
6. ALL vehicles parked in and around the ground are parked at the owner's own risk
7. No unauthorised vehicles can be parked within the Clubhouse car park and the Club reserves the right to move any vehicles in contravention of this regulation and shall not liable for any damages caused.

HENDON FC

Hendon FC are now into their 11th season (including the aborted one last spring) under the ownership of their supporters, following their takeover of the club in the summer of 2010.

Hendon has an illustrious and proud history. The club was formed in 1908, beginning its existence as Christ Church Hampstead. In their inaugural season, the club finished as champions of the Finchley & District League Third Division. There was regular success in the early years, but not before the first of four name changes.

Ahead of the 1909–10 season, the club became Hampstead Town, and immediately won the Finchley & District League Second Division title, and the First Division title followed a year later. Further successes followed as the club gained senior status in 1912 (entering the FA and county cups for the first time) and competing in both the London and Middlesex Leagues. On the back of this, the club was elected into the Athenian League in 1914, one of the best competitions in amateur football, this just six years into the club's existence.

Hampstead Town had played only two matches in 1914–15 when season was abandoned because of the outbreak of war. In their eventual debut season, 1919–20, the club finished a highly creditable fourth. The club finished runners-up in 1929, 1933, 1948, 1949 and 1952, before eventually winning the title in 1953. Further titles followed in 1956 and 1961.

The second renaming of the club came in 1926, when the suffix Town was dropped, and the club was simply called Hampstead. Seven years later the club became Golders Green and the final name change came in 1946 when the club became known as Hendon.

There had been another Hendon club – it reached the quarter-finals of the FA Cup in 1883 – and, in 1932, Hendon and Hampstead met in two friendlies, the second of which was to raise funds for the former club. Sadly, Hendon ceased to exist a couple of years later, but their continued existence meant Hampstead had been unable to take the name in 1933. It was as Golders Green that the club made its first appearance in the FA Cup competition proper, losing in the first round to Southend United in 1933–34.

In 1963, the club was accepted into the Isthmian League and the Greens were members for 55 seasons, always competing in the top division. Success continued as they finished runners-up in their first season, followed by the first of two league titles a year later. Hendon were again champions in 1973, having added to their runners-up achievements in 1966, 1974 and 2015. Indeed, in their first 11 seasons in the Isthmian League, Hendon never finished lower than sixth. Since then the club has had both good and bad seasons in the League, and in 2006 the club was reprieved from relegation due to another club's financial misfortune.

During the amateur era, the club reached the final of the FA Amateur Cup no less than five times, winning in 1960 (against Kingstonian), 1965 (against Whitley Bay) and 1972 (against Enfield) but losing in 1955 (against Bishop Auckland) and 1966 (against Wealdstone).

The club throughout its history has enjoyed FA Cup success. As well as 21 appearances in the first round (most recently at Aldershot Town in 2012), there have been six appearances in the second round (most recently in 1999–2000 at Blackpool)

and one in the third round in January 1974 which saw the Greens draw 1–1 at Newcastle United before losing the replay 4–0 at Watford FC's Vicarage Road.

The club has also enjoyed much glory in county cups, winning the Middlesex Senior Cup no less than 16 times out of 28 final appearances, as well as winning the Middlesex Charity Cup 14 times (two of which, in 1945 and 1988, were at Wembley Stadium). The London Senior Cup has been won on six occasions, with a further 11 appearances in the final.

Hampstead moved into its Claremont Road ground in 1926, the first game being an FA Cup tie against Berkhamsted Town 18 September, which Hendon won 4–3. The final match was played 82 years later, almost to the day, on 20 September 2008, when local rivals Wealdstone won 4–1 (Hendon's last goal at Claremont Road came from Dave Diedhiou, who would make 380 appearances and score 43 goals).

After leaving Claremont Road, Hendon spent four years ground-sharing with Wembley FC and, from 2013, a three-season arrangement with Harrow Borough FC at Earlsmead. In February 2014, plans moved apace to return close to the London Borough of Barnet at the old Kingsbury Town FC ground, Silver Jubilee Park (the borough boundary is around 20 metres behind the clubhouse). A FIFA-accredited 3G all-weather pitch was installed and certified in October 2014. Following this, a successful planning application in July 2015 allowed the club – with Edgware Town FC – to redevelop the stadium.

In 2014, Hendon relaunched their youth section, with 15 sides taking the field. This youth policy paid dividends after as a number of players have moved up from the youth team to the senior side and one,

Keagan Cole, aged 18, became the youngest ever Hendon player to complete 100 first-team appearances (17 goals). In 2016–17, Hendon added girls teams to boys youth teams.

Hendon's move into Silver Jubilee Park in 2016 was more successful off the pitch than on it and it took until January for a first home League win to be achieved. A last-day draw, completing a run of 22 points from 10 games, saw the club achieve safety from relegation. The 2017–18 season was nearly glorious. Led by the prolific 92-goal attack of Niko Muir (40 goals – first in 19 years), Zak Joseph (18), Ashley Nathaniel-George (17) and Josh Walker (17), Hendon roared to third place in the Bostik League – second top-three finish in four seasons – and reached the playoff final. Sadly, it was not to be as Dulwich Hamlet won a penalty shoot-out.

A new era dawned in summer 2018 as The Football Association announced that Hendon would be playing in the Southern Premier Division South, the Greens' first League change since 1963. An even bigger change came as manager Gary McCann, his coaching staff and every senior player moved on to pastures new (though, one, Luke Tingey, did return at the end of preseason). Hendon made a great start to their new competition and were second in December, but a long losing run saw them narrowly avoid relegation in spring 2019. The Greens made a slow start to the new season and, in November, manager Jimmy Gray departed, being replaced by Biggleswade Town boss Lee Allinson.

Lee, whose father Ian played for Arsenal and now manages St Albans City, was a talented midfielder who started his playing career at Watford and went on to play for

Harlow Town, Barton Rovers, Enfield, Stotfold, Borehamwood, Arlesey Town and Biggleswade Town before becoming assistant manager, then manager there. An experienced coach, he – with his wife Faye – has run his own coaching academy in Stevenage since 2012.

Did you know that

- 100,000 watched Hendon against northern giants Bishop Auckland in the 1955 Amateur Cup Final at Wembley.
- Following an invitation from the F.A. to test the system Hendon were the first club to play under floodlights at Wembley Stadium. **The first team beat the reserves 1–0.**
- In the early 1950s, Hendon became the first team in Britain to win a floodlit cup-tie when they won a London Challenge Cup match against Arsenal at Highbury.
- **In 1964–65, Hendon created probably a unique record for a visiting team when they won two matches scoring four goals at Highbury in the same season. Arsenal were beaten 4–3 in a London Challenge Cup tie – after the Gunners led 3–0 – and Finchley were downed 4–1 in an FA Amateur Cup semi-final.**
- The club's original colours were blue, but changed to green during the Second World War, when the club was Golders Green. In 1997–98 the club replaced their now traditional green and brought back the original blue resulting in an outcry from supporters and the green was restored two seasons later!
- England's three highest capped Amateur Internationals between World War 2 and May 1974 were all Hendon players. Rod Haider (65 caps), John Swannell (61) and Mike Pinner (52) lead the way with Peter Deadman (40) and Laurie Topp (32) make it five Hendon players in the top ten of England cap winners.

• Hendon progressed through the round in which they entered the FA Cup for 29 consecutive seasons, 1985–2014. The run ended against AFC Sudbury in September 2014.

Leon Smith equalled an 89-year-old club record when he scored in eight consecutive games during the 2014–15 season. The record was first set by Oscar Reinke in 1925. Leon is only the fourth player in the club's history to score in 7 or more consecutive games, and the first post-war player to score in 6 in a row.

• In June 2015, Charlie Goode became the second Hendon player, after Phil Gridelet, to play for the England Non-League team, now England C. Peter Deadman turned down the honour in May 1974, not wanting to miss Hendon's end-of-season run-in. He would have been one of the very few players to earn Amateur and Semi-Professional honours.

• The club's nicknames are the Greens or the Dons. They were the Green, even when they wore blue in the mid-1930s but at the time, the club was still known as Golders Green.

• Many Hendon players have stepped up to the Football League, including Iain Dowie and Junior Lewis. In recent years, Charlie Goode signed for Scunthorpe United and, in 2018 and 2019, respectively, Ashley Nathaniel-George and Ricardo German joined Crawley Town. **Also in 2019, Jacob Gardiner-Smith signed for Wycombe Wanderers.**

• Hendon set a new club record with a 25-match unbeaten run in 2015. After a loss to Peacehaven & Telscombe in January, the Greens did not lose again until the Ryman League Premier Division Playoff final in mid-May.

• Hendon's longest serving manager was Gary McCann, who was in charge from February 2005 until May 2018. Both his assistant Freddie Hyatt – like McCann a former player – the club's physical therapist Mark Findley also gave more than 10 years of service.

FROM the typewriter

People talk about the romance of the FA Cup and there is nothing more romantic than a non-league side going on an FA Cup run. That thought will be very much on the minds of both Crawley Down Gatwick and Hendon tonight, with a second qualifying round place up for grabs for the winners.

In my 30 years in journalism I was lucky enough to report on some great FA Cup moments for Sussex sides – memories both of the occasions themselves and one or two funny tales, some of which never made it into print. Like Lewes, in 2001, as they played Stoke City at the Britannia Stadium in a first round tie. This was before Lewes rose through the leagues to the Conference premier and at the time it was the furthest they had ever gone in the FA Cup. It was a fairytale day out for Little Lewes who took 1,500 fans with them to Stoke. What none of them knew was that one of their star players nearly didn't play in the game ... because he had been involved in a street fight, which left him with a broken hand. Perhaps I was an old school journalist, but I had an excellent relationship with the Lewes manager Jimmy Quinn who persuaded me to keep the real story quiet, in return for a big exclusive on something else. So, less than 24 hours before Lewes' big day out, Quinn and I sat in a coffee shop in Brighton agreeing what the official line was going to be, whether the player played or not. He duly played with "an injury suffered at work" explaining the cast he wore.

Lewes put up a battling display before losing 2-0 and there is post-script to the match for me. As the main Lewes reporter I was asked after the game which Lewes player I wanted to interview in the press room. I asked for my man-of-the-match Paul Thomsett who duly arrived in the press room wearing – for some bizarre reason – right-back Matt Beeston's shirt. Not knowing the Lewes players, some of the less observant national press reporters genuinely thought they were interviewing Beeston and duly quoted him in their after-match reports before the error was pointed out.

I was also lucky enough to cover two great FA Cup runs for Crawley Town, one being when they got to the fifth round as a non-league side and played Manchester United at Old Trafford in February 2011. The other, almost 20 years before that, was Crawley's run as a Southern League side to the third round in 1991-92, culminating in an all-Sussex clash with Brighton and Hove Albion at the Goldstone

Ground. Along the way Crawley beat Northampton Town 4-2 in the first round when I may have invented fake news! Crawley had sprung a surprise for the Northampton game by bringing former Brighton winger Tony Towner out of retirement for the game. We had a junior reporter in our office who was a Crawley fan and very easy to wind-up, so on the Monday after the match I came up with a fake story just for him that Towner was an ineligible player and Crawley were being kicked out of the competition. I even mocked up a fake back page, to reinforce my wind-up. However, things got out of hand when my junior colleague phoned all his Crawley friends revealing our 'exclusive' story and someone in turn told a rival newspaper. When Crawley Town released a statement saying the story was all nonsense I had to confess my wind-up had got out of hand!

Another FA Cup run I remember reporting on was Hastings United getting to the third round and playing away to Middlesbrough in 2013. The issue that still stands out for me from that day was that the official away attendance was 1,068. Surely someone could have missed off two people and made it Hastings 1066!

This FA is great and fans of both sides tonight will be dreaming of creating their own memories.

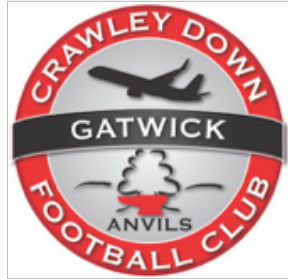

Good evening everybody, and welcome to the Haven for today's Emirates FA Cup 1st Qual Rd fixture against Hendon.

This is only the second time in its history CDG has reached this far in the FA Cup. This in itself highlights how the squad has developed over the past couple of years. I genuinely feel this season we have built a squad to match the very best teams that this club has seen since its foundation.

In the second half I felt that we started to control the game, and created numerous chances, all of which fell just short. In return Lancing did little to trouble our back line, although Blair Cooney did prevent an unjustified result with a goal line clearance with only 10 minutes of the game left. The game finished 1-1 and whilst many might have felt that was a fair result, we left disappointed not to have taken all three points. Still, Saturday has left us unbeaten in 5 games, and if we had been offered that before the season, then we would have taking it.

Today we take on Hendon. We know very little about our opponents, as this is the first time the two teams will have met.

Hendon have only just started their season, but have already won some silverware following a notable victory against a Brentford B team.

Saturday saw them draw 1-1 against Salisbury, with a David Beckham wonder goal being scored by Hendon to make the game 1-1.

No doubt they will prove a very difficult test for us, but I have faith that on our day, with the squad we have, we are capable of competing with teams in the leagues above us.

Whatever happens this evening, I want the players to enjoy and savour the occasion.

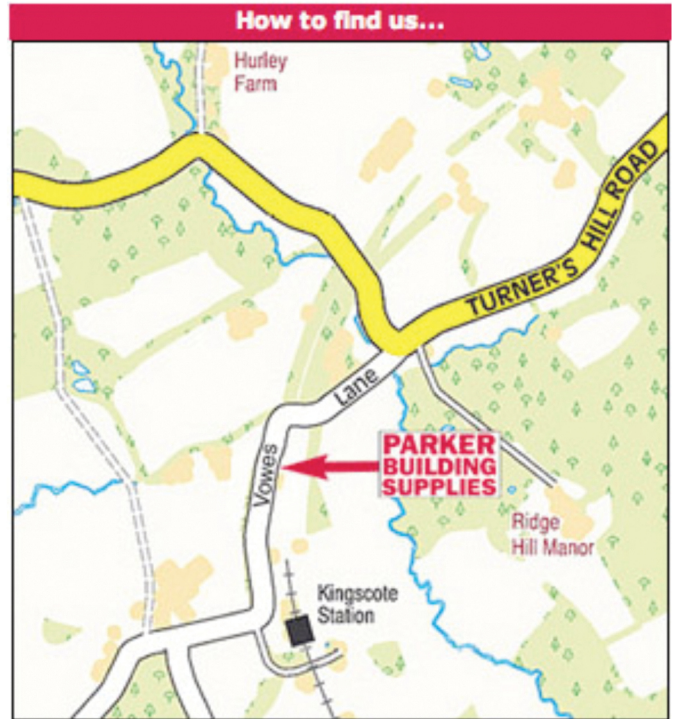

ANVILS 'The History'



Crawley Down Gatwick FC have made a remarkable rise from parks football to the Ryman League in less than 20 years. The club was only formed in 1993 but have enjoyed the type of success many could only hope for in their short history. In 2011 Sussex County League title success and promotion to Step 4 Football was followed by an appearance at the AMEX in the Sussex Senior Cup Final in 2012.

1983-95 Delving back into the history books to 1983, Crawley Down United could be found nestled in Division Six of the Mid Sussex League. By 1988 the club had risen to Div One, winning three league titles and finishing runners-up on two occasions. After three seasons in Div One they won promotion to the Premier Division as runners up to Lindfield. **1993/94** culminated in a merger of four local sides and adopting the name Crawley Down Village they finished third in the following season. 1994/5 they claimed their first Premier Division title by a massive margin of ten points from 2nd placed Wealden.

1995-2003 In 1995 the Anvils joined the Sussex County League Division Three. In the first season they finished second and found themselves making an even swifter move into Senior Football. They also reached the final of the Intermediate Cup. The first two seasons in Division Two provided much sought after consolidation but in the 1998-99 season they finished in a promotion position but only to be denied a place in Division One because they could not persuade Mid Sussex District Council to allow the installation of floodlights in time. The following season they thought they had finished in a promotion spot again only to be thwarted by a late decision to award Lancing three extra points after Mile Oak had fielded an illegible player. The next four seasons were not so easy for the club with changes of management and they finished no higher than 11th in that period.

The 2004-07 era was better as they finished tenth and fifth and In the Division Two Cup, they reached the semi-final stage two years running. 2006-07 was a struggle only staying up after an outstanding finish to the season loosing just two of the last 14 matches. Cup form was better, reaching both the Q/F of the Sussex RUR Cup and the Div Two Cup.

2007-08 was a massive year for the club as the culmination of 10 years' hard work behind the scenes paid off with the Anvils given the go ahead to upgrade facilities. Floodlights, hard standing and stands followed and were in place for the start of the new season. The Team finished 6th and reached the semi-final of the John O'Hara League Cup. In the FA Vase they reached the 4th round losing away at Brockenhurst. The Anvils also entertained Brighton & HA in the Sussex Senior Cup. By now, the club were gaining momentum on and off the pitch and they finally won promotion to Div One with a third place finish.

2009-2010 Many expected the Division One new boys to struggle but they defied the odds to enjoy a tremendous season, finishing eighth in the league and enjoying good cup runs in the FA Cup and FA Vase as well as reaching the League Cup Final.

2010-11 Proved to be the most successful season in the club's history as the Anvils won the County League Division One and promotion to the Ryman League by a margin of 15 points as well as winning the RUR Cup. They reached the semi-finals of both the John O'Hara and the Sussex Senior Cups where they lost to Blue Square prem side Eastbourne Borough. **2011-14** Saw the Club compete in the Ryman Isthmian South for the first time and the Club set about building a team to compete at this level, finishing in 15th place and also getting to the Sussex Senior Cup Final at the AMEX, losing out in the last minute to Ryman South Champions Whitehawk. A name change to Crawley Down Gatwick FC was approved highlighting the wider area to which the Club is now associated. **2012/13** Season started remarkably well with the team topping the Ryman South table through to November but finally finishing in 13th position. Forced Manager changes meant a massive dip in form in **2013/14**, which saw the Anvils plummet from the top of the table to 19th Place by the end of Jan and finally end up second to bottom and relegation back to the Sussex County League. **2014/15** The Club decided after rejoining the County League to go back to its roots and use local players, unfortunately this did not work out and the Club were in the relegation zone by Xmas. The team finally ended 2nd to bottom and further relegation followed to the newly named Southern Combination League Div 1. **2015/17** Saw the revival of the side under Paul Cooper as the rebuilt Anvils challenged at the top all season, finally finishing in 2nd place behind Haywards Hth Town and 14 points clear of 3rd placed Oakwood to gain promotion back to the Southern Combination Premier Division.

2017-19 Back in the SCL Prem the side continued its improvement finishing in a midtable position and reached the RUR Cup Final in that first year. The following season they achieved a midtable finish again and a PB cup Semi final. James Day took over the side from **2018-19** and did well in his first season as the side finished in 9th place with 57 points. **2019/20** Covid dominated and the League was abandoned with CDG in 6th Pos.
