## Haven Ground Regulations

1. All persons entering this ground are only admitted subject to these rules and regulations of the Football Association

2. The Club reserves the right to prosecute or to eject, or cause to be ejected, any persons who within the ground or the club premises is considered by the club, it's employees or agents (hereafter called the Club), in their absolute discretion to be, or to have been, behaving in any of the following ways:-

a) Entering the field of play before or during the course of a game of a game. The field of play is that area within the railings surrounding the perimeter of the pitch.

b) Using obscene or abusive language or persistent swearing.

c) Being drunk or under the influence of drink or drugs to any degree.

d) Making vulgar gestures.

e) Using terms of abuse, racial or otherwise.

3) No bottles, metal cans, glasses, placards, banners, firearms, knives or other similar articles are permitted and the Police and Club stewards have the right to search any spectator at anytime, and to confiscate any article which they consider could be a danger to other spectators.

4. NO alcohol to be consumed within the ground without the use of a plastic glass. Alcohol in glass containers can only be consumed within the confines of the Clubhouse. Passes are available at half-time.

5. The climbing of floodlight pylons, stands and other building structures is strictly forbidden. Club Stewards have the right to eject any persons found doing so.

6. ALL vehicles parked in and around the ground are parked at the owner's own risk

7. No unauthorised vehicles can be parked within the Clubhouse car park and the Club reserves the right to move any vehicles in contravention of this regulation and shall not liable for any damages caused.

8. No Air Horns, Drums or Loud Musical Instruments are allowed inside the ground, Any Flares, fireworks or other implements thrown will mean immediate ejection from the ground.

# Spelthorne Sports FC

Spelthorne Sports Club was founded in 1922 having purchased around 11 acres of land and has been providing sports for the local community ever since. We currently have 2 full sized football pitches and field 3 adult football teams and 2 Sunday teams along with a Youth Section covering Little Kickers through to the Mid-week Flood Lit Under 18's, a total of 21 youth teams competing every Sunday in the Surrey Youth and Surrey Primary Leagues. The Youth Section was awarded the FA Charter Standard in March 2010 and the Annual Youth Tournament draws in many local teams since its inauguration in 2010.

In season 1998-99, Richard Ford and Micky Fisher took control of their 1st full season and saw them rise up the table. Both players were long serving Spelly players and had now moved into the management side. The team were led by Paul Fernandez with Paul Wilson in goal and Ian & Nick Croxford playing their 1st seasons with Spelly. We finished the season in 3rd spot and reached the final of the Russell Grant cup, where Sports did their usual thing of blowing it and lost to Northolt Saints 2-0 in the final at Uxbridge after they had beaten and drawn with them earlier in the season. (P18 W10 D5 L3 F35 A18 P35)

2001 was the first season of the new management team of Paul Martyn Jones (Trigger) and Ian Croxford. The team had the two scoring machines of James (OGGY) Hogg and Nick Croxford playing up front and with eventual player of the year Wes Coles in goal, this was the most successful season for many a year. The team went from October through to April without losing a league game taking the league title in front of Willesden Constantine by 5 points, they were on the road to a league and cup double but were beat in the semi-finals by Willesden with future professional footballer Enoch Showammi smashing home a 25-yard free kick.

In 2007, after many great years playing in the Middlesex league it was decided that a move to the Surrey League was required. The main driving force for this was that the league had expanded in such that games were across London and for an amateur side an away trip to Bethnal Green was an all-day event. The move to the Surrey Western was a change that was needed with pleasant drives through the country playing village teams rather than long hauls across London. With the management now in the hands of Steve Flatman, a long-time player and member of the club, the team saw a steady growth, and this must be credited to Steve. The first season saw Sports finish 7th (P26 W10 D10 L6 F50 A39 P40) with Horsley running away with the league. The next season saw some old faces come back into the team to support the young bucks with Ogy, Mike Jenkins and Ian Croxford coming back to support the team. The team finished second behind Ripley with Rob Smith finishing top league scorer with 21 and Lee Staples not far behind on 19. The season had its climax when Sports played their 1st final in many a year against Abbey Rangers at a very dusty Cobham FC and with the team leading 1-0 at half time through a Jake Flatman goal, they somehow grabbed defeat from the jaws of victory losing 2-1 with a spectacular 20-yard own goal from Aaron Stewart.

In 2009, Spelthorne Sports again moved leagues for the second time in three seasons as we progressed up through the FA pyramid system, this time to the Surrey Elite league. The season started well but it was discovered that a (nameless) player had played with a ban from his now disbanded Sunday team. This resulted with Spelly being deducted all points that had been awarded while he was playing that season, 9 in total. Spelly finished the season 5th (P28 W17 D1 L10 F70 A52 P43) if we had not lost the points, we could possibly have finished third or even higher as the disappointment of losing these points was a bitter pill to swallow.

In the 2010-11 season Spelthorne Sports Football Club 1st Eleven Completed a league and cup double victory by winning the Surrey Elite Intermediate League and the Surrey intermediate Challenge cup. Their league success means they won promotion to the combined counties league which covers levels 9 and 10 of the English Football League System. Steve Flatman continues to be involved with the football section and is always on call!

In 2013-14, the Spelly won the Middlesex FA Intermediate Cup, beating Middlesex County Premier side Cricklewood Wanderers 3-0 in the Final. On 16 April 2014, Spelthorne Sports were crowned Combined Counties Division One Champions with a 2-1 win away to Epsom Athletic. They lifted the trophy 3 days later following an emphatic 7-0 win at home to local rivals Staines Lammas. The Spelly also won the RPM Records Division One Challenge Cup against Staines Lammas at Windsor FC on 5 May 2014. A single second half Lee Staples goal was enough to make sure The Spelly lifted the trophy, winning the league and cup treble in the process.

The team went on a phenomenal 46 game unbeaten run in all competitions that season, beating teams in cup competitions from higher divisions such as Frimley Green, Staines Town (on pens), Walton Casuals, Wembley, and Epsom & Ewell (on pens). That unbeaten run finally came to an end on 7 May 2014 when they played Combined Counties Premier Division side Hanworth Villa in the Southern Combination Cup Final, losing 1-0. The game was played at home and marked the club's first ever game under the newly installed floodlights. The lads then suffered their second defeat of the season to the same opposition when the sides met again 3 days later in the Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup Final, again losing 1-0.

The 2013-14 season was extremely successful for Spelthorne Sports. Winning two cup finals and finishing runners-up in another two cup finals. However, the biggest achievement by far was winning the league without losing a single game in the process. Winning 22, drawing 8, losing 0, scoring 92, and conceding 23.

Season 2015/16 saw our first appearance in the FA CUP with a 2-1 home win against Stotfold. We then travelled to Cogenhoe only to lose 3-0. The season continued with a change of management back under the control of Steve Flatman with support from Paul Burgess and Mark Harper.

Season 2016/17 saw us off to a great start in the FA Cup beating CCL Winners Hartley Wintney 4-3, only to fall at the next hurdle losing 2-3 at home to Andover Town. Season 2017/18 ended in us reaching our first Senior Cup Final against local rivals Hanworth Villa, only to narrowly lose 3-2 on the day. Season 2018/19 saw our best ever FA Cup runs and our highest Premier Division finish (6<sup>th</sup> place), having finished 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup> in our first 3.

Season 2019/20 will be remembered as the one that wasn't! However, we shall remember it as being 2<sup>nd</sup> in the table with Mark Harper, Daren Bulman & Andy Viney at the helm. Following this, we again had to deal with the COVID pandemic, and another cut short season. That season saw a re-shuffle of step 5 leagues with Combined Counties now having North & South Premier Divisions. We are in the North Div and welcomed some new opponents to THE SPELLY! We also welcomed Jason Tucker to the coaching team.

2021/2022 saw the start of an U23 squad for the first time at the Spelly under the joint management of Dan Green & Myles Hook. Dave Knox assisting.

This season sees yet again a reshuffle of the league with new teams transferring across Step 5. Myles has taken over management of the U23's with Dave and Dave Reid assisting.

# FROM the typewriter

Despite the midweek defeat, three wins out of four in all competitions has been a good start to the season for Crawley Down Gatwick but it is not just at first team level where the club is thriving. This season we are fielding an U18 team in the Southern Combination League U18 North Division for a third year on the trot after a number of seasons without such a side. The fruits of that were clearly evident last season with six members of the 2021-22 U18s side making appearances for the first team during the course of the campaign, not to mention others like goalkeeper Alex Bellingham who have played for the club's junior sides in the past.

Despite being a village club, Crawley Down Gatwick really is in good health at the moment and for the 2022-23 season we will have a record number of teams or training groups in action every week. Our 28 teams now comprise a first team, an U18s side and 26 teams or training groups from U5s up to U16s, including nine girls' only groups.

The latter figure is impressive, particularly on the back of England women's team winning the European Championships this season. This summer's exploits have created added interest in the women's game in this country, but we have been ahead of the game at Crawley Down Gatwick, rapidly building the number of girls' teams or training groups from none four years ago to where we are now with groups at each age group from U6s up to U14s. But our belief that football is for all goes back longer than that, with numerous girls playing for our junior teams alongside boys over a number of years. Indeed, our U13s Hammers squad which won a Horsham League divisional title in 2017 included three girls, all of whom eventually went on to play for bigger clubs (the girls' teams of Brighton and Hove Albion, Charlton Athletic and Lewes).

While we are delighted with the growth in girls' football at our club, we must also continue to support the promotion of boys

through the club to play for the men's first team in the future, which is why the U18s are so important.

In that respect, we are proud that we have a number of teams who enjoyed plenty of success last season, suggesting that we have plenty of talent within the club to feed into the first team in the future. Last season, our U15s won Horsham League Division A, our U14s won Mid Sussex League Division Two, our U13s Hammers were challenging for the title in their division and our U12s Anvils finished runners-up in their league.

The other aspect of our success story at junior level is that we start at U5s, for children in reception year at school, we offer them good coaching from the start while still keeping it fun and we make them feel part of the 'one club' with first team players coming along to the end of season Junior Presentation Evening to present medals to our youngest children and awards to others.

We currently have 20 boys and girls eagerly awaiting to begin with our new U5s group in September. Some will ask how that fits into the first team picture? Well, the dream is one or two of those could be playing for the first team in the years to come. That progression has happened already and it will happen again, and that's why we are quietly proud of what we have here at Crawley Down.

# FROM 'The Dugout'



Good afternoon everyone and welcome to today's Emirates FA Cup fixture against Spelthorne Sports FC.

Firstly, I just wanted to say a quick thank you to Matt Crane, who has covered the last two management notes due to me being on holiday. I enjoyed reading Matt's musings and thought he did a great job in giving insight into the squad and our thoughts on the first few games. He also did a great job, alongside the rest of the management team, in leading us to a notable victory against promotion favourites Newhaven.

On Tuesday night we faced Eastbourne Town in the league. Off the back of 3 wins from 3 we went into the game full of confidence. Games against Eastbourne are always difficult, but, following a managerial change in the summer, we didn't know what to expect from our opponents.

The game started at a frantic pace, with Crawley Down getting on the front foot and making it difficult for our opponents. During the first 25 minutes we created a number of chances, but failed to capitalise on these. As inevitably happens in football, our opponent's confidence grew as the game went on and we failed to score. Eastbourne took the lead around the 30th minute mark. The goal was a sloppy one from our perspective, which we should have defended. Unfortunately for us, the first goal was quickly followed by a second. A soft free kick given away within striking distance, which our opponent's took advantage of. From the moment the second goal went in, Eastbourne never looked like losing, and if we are honest, the game could have finished worse than 0-2. Despite us seeing more of the ball, they looked a constant threat on the counter, hitting the bar and post on multiple occasions, and restricted us to half chances. The game ended 0-2, and with our first loss of the

season. A well deserved victory for Eastbourne.

Despite the loss, training on Thursday night was upbeat and positive. We talked through what happened on Tuesday, and the things we would like to change, and I feel this has put us in good stead for the game today. One of the things I reminded the players of was that this is still the beginning of a journey for this team. This reflects the seriousness of the risks to fans and staff – pyros can burn at 2000 degrees Celsius and cause life-changing injuries, while entering the pitch endangers players, managers and match officials. It also impacts the hard working volunteers, who ensure that our special part of the game continues to run.

We know those who commit these illegal acts do not represent the majority of supporters. Please work with us to call out the risks.

Today we have more FA Cup magic at the Haven as we welcome Spelthorne Sports. As far as I am aware it will be the first ever meeting between the two Clubs. I would like to wish a warm Crawley Down welcome to the players, management, committee members and supporters of our visitors. We hope you enjoy your brief visit.

We went into the game against Eastbourne Town on Tuesday buoyed by a great start to the season. A superb 5-0 home win over Loxwood, an even better 2-1 home win over bogey team Newhaven either side of a brilliant FA Cup win at Crowborough left me, not known for my overwhelming optimism, almost expecting to beat Eastbourne Town. What transpired was the ultimate crash and burn scenario, the ultimate illustration of what a funny game football can be. James made a number of changes from the Newhaven game. We sometimes need to cut them a bit of slack. No player has an off day deliberately. I know it is hard to believe but sometimes I even have an off day. Anyway, the best and most reasonable and logical explanation I heard on the night was that we lost because Michael Belli was wearing number 6 and not his regular number 8.

We finally had our photoshoot with shirt sponsors Ridgeway Training [www.ridgewaytraining.co.uk](http://www.ridgewaytraining.co.uk) before the game. Tony Brown was not able to get to the Haven to do it so a big thank you to my son in law Dale who stayed on and took some good action pictures as well. You will notice a leaning towards motor sports but I must admit I think his nature photography is outstanding.

# ANVILS 'The History'



**Crawley Down Gatwick FC** have made a remarkable rise from parks football to the Ryman League in less than 20 years. The club was only formed in 1993 but have enjoyed the type of success many could only hope for in their short history. In 2011 Sussex County League title success and promotion to Step 4 Football was followed by an appearance at the AMEX in the Sussex Senior Cup Final in 2012.

**1983-95** Delving back into the history books to 1983, Crawley Down United could be found nestled in Division Six of the Mid Sussex League. By 1988 the club had risen to Div One, winning three league titles and finishing runners-up on two occasions. After three seasons in Div One they won promotion to the Premier Division as runners up to Lindfield. **1993/94** culminated in a merger of four local sides and adopting the name Crawley Down Village they finished third in the following season. 1994/5 they claimed their first Premier Division title by a massive margin of ten points from 2nd placed Wealden.

**1995-2003** In 1995 the Anvils joined the Sussex County League Division Three. In the first season they finished second and found themselves making an even swifter move into Senior Football. They also reached the final of the Intermediate Cup. The first two seasons in Division Two provided much sought after consolidation but in the 1998-99 season they finished in a promotion position but only to be denied a place in Division One because they could not persuade Mid Sussex District Council to allow the installation of floodlights in time. The following season they thought they had finished in a promotion spot again only to be thwarted by a late decision to award Lancing three extra points after Mile Oak had fielded an illegible player. The next four seasons were not so easy for the club with changes of management and they finished no higher than 11th in that period.

**The 2004-07** era was better as they finished tenth and fifth and In the Division Two Cup, they reached the semi-final stage two years running. 2006-07 was a struggle only staying up after an outstanding finish to the season losing just two of the last 14 matches. Cup form: Q/F of the Sussex RUR Cup and the Div Two Cup.

**2007-08** was a massive year for the club as the culmination of 10 years' hard work behind the scenes paid off with the Anvils given the go ahead to upgrade facilities. Floodlights, hard standing and stands followed and were in place for the start of the new season. The Team finished 6th and reached the semi-final of the John O'Hara League Cup. In the FA Vase they reached the 4th round losing away at Brockenhurst. The Anvils also entertained Brighton & HA in the Sussex Senior Cup. By now, the club were gaining momentum on and off the pitch and they finally won promotion to Div One with a third place finish.

**2009-2010** Many expected the Division One new boys to struggle but they defied the odds to enjoy a tremendous season, finishing eighth in the league and enjoying good cup runs in the FA Cup and FA Vase as well as reaching the League Cup Final.

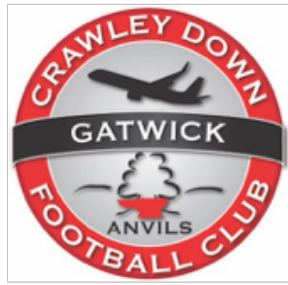
**2010-11** Proved to be the most successful season in the club's history as the Anvils won the County League Division One and promotion to the Ryman League by a margin of 15 points as well as winning the RUR Cup. They reached the semi-finals of both the John O'Hara and the Sussex Senior Cups where they lost to Blue Square prem side Eastbourne Borough. **2011-14** Saw the Club compete in the Ryman Isthmian South for the first time and the Club set about building a team to compete at this level, finishing in 15th place and also getting to the Sussex Senior Cup Final at the AMEX, losing out in the last minute to Ryman South Champions Whitehawk. A name change to Crawley Down Gatwick FC was approved highlighting the wider area to which the Club is now associated. **2012/13** Season started remarkably well with the team topping the Ryman South table through to November but finally finishing in 13th position. Forced Manager changes meant a massive dip in form in **2013/14**, which saw the Anvils plummet from the top of the table to 19th Place by the end of Jan and finally end up second to bottom and relegation back to the Sussex County League.

**2014/15** The Club decided after rejoining the County League to go back to its roots and use local players, unfortunately this did not work out and the Club were in the relegation zone by Xmas. The team finally ended 2nd to bottom and further relegation followed to the newly named Southern Combination League Div 1.

**2015/17** Saw the revival of the side under Paul Cooper as the rebuilt Anvils challenged at the top all season, finally finishing in 2nd place behind Haywards Hth Town and 14 points clear of 3rd placed Oakwood to gain promotion back to the Southern Combination Premier Division.

**2017-22** Back in the SCL Prem the side continued its improvement finishing in a midtable position and reached the RUR Cup Final in that first year. The following season they achieved a midtable finish and a PB cup Semi final. James Day took over the side from **2018-19** and did well in his first season as the side finished in 9th place with 57 points. **2019/21** Covid dominated and the League was abandoned twice with CDG in 6th Pos. **21-22** 1st full season back after Covid the team again ended mid table but did well to get through to R3 of the FA Vase. Generally a season of many injuries causing a multitude of changes each week.
